	<p><i>What is a "necessary sin?" In our world today, there are some very obvious sins that everyone would agree are always wrong. Murder is always wrong. Stealing is always wrong. But there are some other sins that we tend to believe are easier to justify. Some people would say these are more acceptable, or more respectable, or some might even say "more necessary." We allow certain habits to help us deal with life, but sometimes the bad habits we adopt can become part of our identity. It's time to separate ourselves from these 'necessary' habits and recognize them for what they really are: sins.
